

Getting there

All roads lead to Sylt, whether you travel by car, train, ship, or air.

BY CAR

If you choose to go by car, you will cover the last leg of your journey by motorail. After you board the train in Niebüll, a 40-minute ride over the Hindenburgdamm causeway will take you across the tidal flats to Westerland.

BY FERRY

Alternatively, you can travel by sea: a modern ferry carries both passengers and vehicles from Rømø, Sylt's Danish neighbouring island, to List. The mini-cruise across the North Sea takes about 40 minutes.
