Sylt is more than an island! For its numerous regular visitors Sylt is a philosophy. From single to yuppie, from individual tourists to VIPs, every visitor discovers the island in his or her own way. It is the unmistakable charm and many facets of the island which make this stretch of sand in the ocean so unique: 40 kilometres of beaches with pure sand. Waves, breaking against the west side, quiet tidal shallows in the east. Natural and green dikes. Blooming heather and majestic cliffs. A picturesque idyll. And what is more, a healthy climate and fresh air, as free from pollution as you can get.

Daily reverie and night life. Hustle and bustle complemented by quiet seclusion. Twelve villages, each of which has its own natural style: Pulsating Westerland, picturesque Keitum or one of the other locations situated by the mud flat area of Sylt's rustic eastern shores such as Archsum, Morsum, Munkmarsch and Tinum, chic Kampen, List – the most northerly village in Germany, the villages of Wenningstedt-Braderup and Hörnum, these especially suitable for families, as well as the area on the narrowest part of the island, between mud flats and sea - Rantum.

All roads lead to Sylt: Whoever is travelling by car will complete the last stretch of the journey on the motor-rail "Sylt Shuttle" along the eleven kilometre long Hindenburg embankment. If you would prefer to leave your car at home, you can reach Sylt quickly and easily with passenger trains. Or why not come by sea: Modern ferries depart from Sylt's neighbouring Danish island Römö. The fastest way to get here is by airplane. Scheduled planes (Lufthansa, Air Berlin, TUIfly, Syltair) fly to the island from the major German cities.
